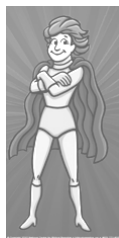

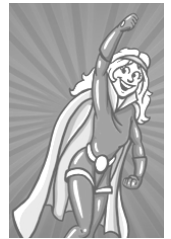
This year at Hero Training Camp we will look at:

Camp will provide... (you do NOT have to bring)

- your workbook and pencil/pen
- a camp t-shirt



YOU need to bring... (camp will not provide)

- **ONE pound (1#) of your favorite wrapped candy (NO GUM)** for prizes and games.
- **WATER-2 bottles or a canteen/refillable water bottle.**
- **BACK PACK** or cloth bag to carry your Bible, workbook, pencil etc.
- **BIBLE**
- **MEDICINES** in original containers to give to camp nurse immediately upon arriving at camp.
- **Sleeping bag** or sheets and a blanket plus your **pillow**. All the stuff you need to sleep tight at night.
- **Towels** - at least 2 for showering and swimming, washcloths, etc.
- **Soap**, shampoo, deodorant, etc. to make yourself look and smell good.
- **Swimsuit.**
 - Girls: Only modest one-piece suits. Two-pieces will not be allowed.
 - Boys: Stick with boxer trunks only.
- **Camp clothes.**
 - **T-shirts and comfortable shorts** that can get dirty. 4 Days worth.
 - **Jacket** for cool nights under the moon and for possibly rainy days.
 - **Girls**, absolutely no spaghetti strap shirts are allowed. All shirts must cover your bellies (NO bare midriffs), and shorts must come at least to the middle of your thigh. Modesty is our key.
 - **Guys**, wear shorts and pants that fit around the waist—nothing that shows your underwear (that's why it's called "underwear").
 - Those not following these clothes guidelines will have some "other sponsor brought" clothes to wear.
- **Comfortable shoes.** Flip flops for the pool and tennis shoes for hiking are essentials. You must wear shoes or sandals at all times.
- **Snack money.** You will be allowed to spend \$2.00 a day for snacks from the concession stand-Monday through Friday- Total of **\$10.00**. We will make sure you have plenty to eat at meal times, plus we will have the "one pound of candy" (NO GUM) from everyone and some evening snacks available. The first meal that we will have is supper on Monday so plan accordingly if you have a long drive to camp. Don't bring any other snacks from home. If you do, the counselors will take them and eat them.
- **Camera**-optional
- **Rain gear**-optional
- **Insect repellent**
- **Flashlight**
- **Watch**
- **Sunscreen**
- Optional music/CD for performers at the Variety Show.
- Campers will not be encouraged to call home unless there is an emergency. Calling home seems to encourage homesickness. We suggest that you write your camper, even a week early (address at the top of this form). We also suggest that you don't come and visit unless there is an emergency. If there is an emergency, please contact the director or nurse.
- **Don't** bring any electronic devices such as cell phones, iPods and shuffle, MP3 players, radios, alarm clocks, CD players, DVD players, boom boxes, computers, game devices and other such. Counselors will take these for the duration of camp and return them when you leave camp. If you bring them for the ride to and from camp, please leave them in the church's vehicle or give them to your counselor.
- **Don't** bring any guns, knives (even the pocket variety), alcohol or tobacco products, fireworks, lighters, illegal drugs or other controlled substances.
- **Do bring** a great attitude and a desire to have an awesome time.

Dear Parents of Jr. Campers:

We want to thank you for considering sending your 3rd-4th-5th grader to Jr. Camp, June 14-18. We are excited about the camp and want you to know that we consider it a privilege to have your child at camp. We do not take this camp lightly. We feel we are partnering with you - the parents/family - in leading your child to get to know Jesus better. We pray that God will change campers' hearts and give them a vision for being the people God has called them to be.

This summer, we will use some curriculum that teaches children about the biblical concept of the conscience. The word "conscience" is used 30 times in the New Testament and is illustrated throughout the Bible many, many times, but most children rarely understand the importance of the conscience for their own lives. In particular the conscience prompts children in four ways: Do what's right, Deal with wrongs, Be Honest, and Care about others.

The conscience helps to make a hero, both in biblical times and today. Heroes are characterized by the same four things as above. As they practice being heroes in the small things, they will prepare their hearts for bigger opportunities to demonstrate heroism as well. Children will learn about their own hearts and how to be internally motivated, promoted by the conscience and the Holy Spirit in their lives. Children will be challenged in a number of ways with the idea that they can be heroes now. That's how God designed them. That's what living for God is all about.

We will be taking advantage of all of the teachable moments in our activities, games, crafts and even our snack times. It's our prayer that camp will give children a vision for living their lives for God. After all, that's what a true hero is.
